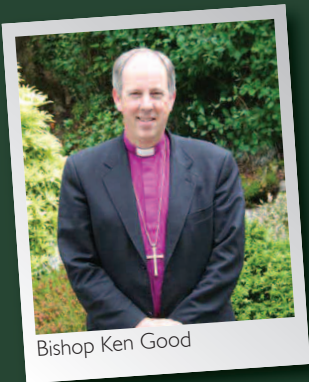

# THE BOOK OF COMMON PRAYER
